What is a certified wildlife habitat? It's a property that meets criteria established by the National Wildlife Federation, which include the following elements: **Food, Water, Cover, Places to raise young, and Utilizing sustainable gardening practices.**

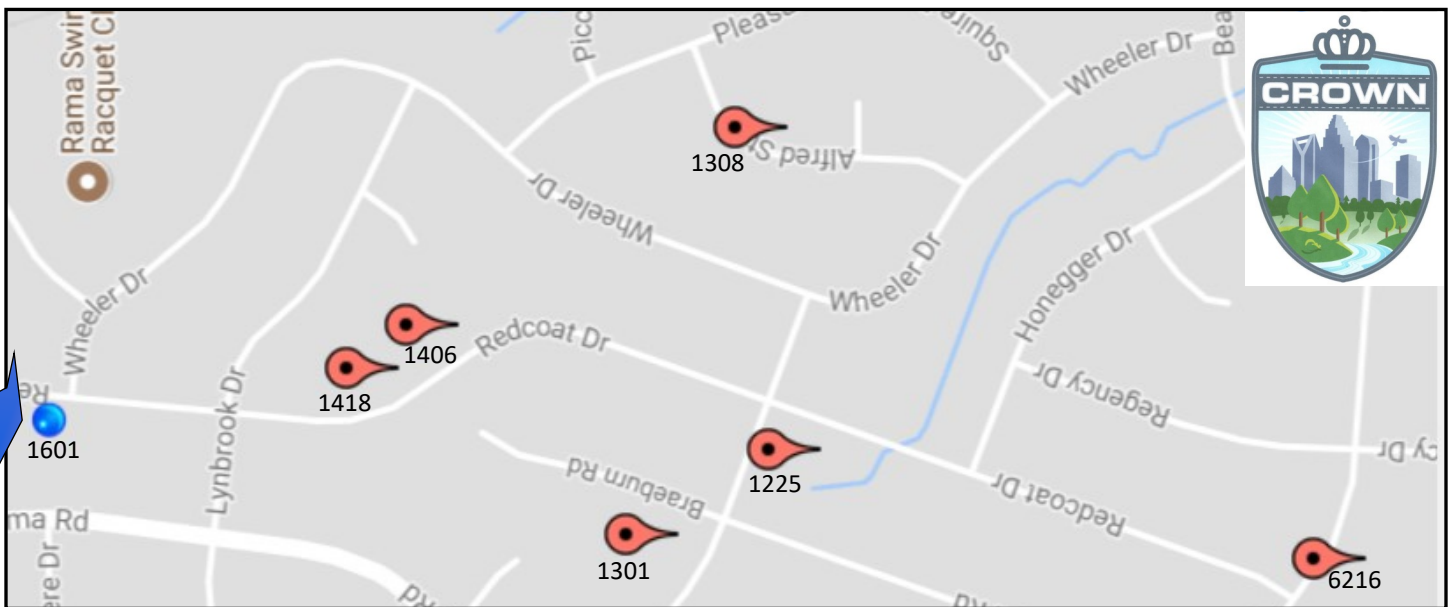

**START 1601 Redcoat Drive** (in adjacent Queens Grant) **McLaughlin Habitat:** We continue to remove non-native, invasive plants while adding natives, in order to restore natural habitat. Since our garden is modest, we will also have learning activities for kids.

**1418 Redcoat Drive - Herman Habitat:** We are working on a garden filled with native plants that supply food and shelter to the local birds and animals, as well as being a refuge from the daily stresses of life. The garden is constantly changing and expanding.

**1406 Redcoat Drive - Birge Habitat:** Food, fragrance and visual focus converge in one backyard featuring blueberries and figs, tea olives and gardenias, and two flower-filled gardens planted for butterflies and bees. Garden and fescue lawn are virtually pesticide free.

**1225 Redcoat Drive - Smith Habitat:** A busy family's attempt to balance the outdoor needs of pets and a small child, while finding creative ways to attract and nurture wildlife. We're eliminating turf grass to create more planting areas that attract wildlife.

**1308 Alfred Street - Schoonover Habitat:** Nearly year-round blooms are featured in this yard along with walking paths that invite you to stroll through the garden. It includes plenty of berry-producing plants and lush foliage suitable for nesting. Heated bird-bath in winter. A pesticide-free zone.

**1301 Braeburn Road - Bolls Habitat:** As a work in progress, we're incorporating native plants and increasing natural areas. We participate in the Butterfly Highway Project with wildflower patches that nourish pollinators as their beauty nourishes our souls.

**6216 Rocky Falls Road - McLaney Habitat:** This property offers a diverse wildlife habitat with a focus on providing supplemental food and water sources while reducing lawn. All plants added were for the purpose of providing benefit to native wildlife species and year-round interest.
