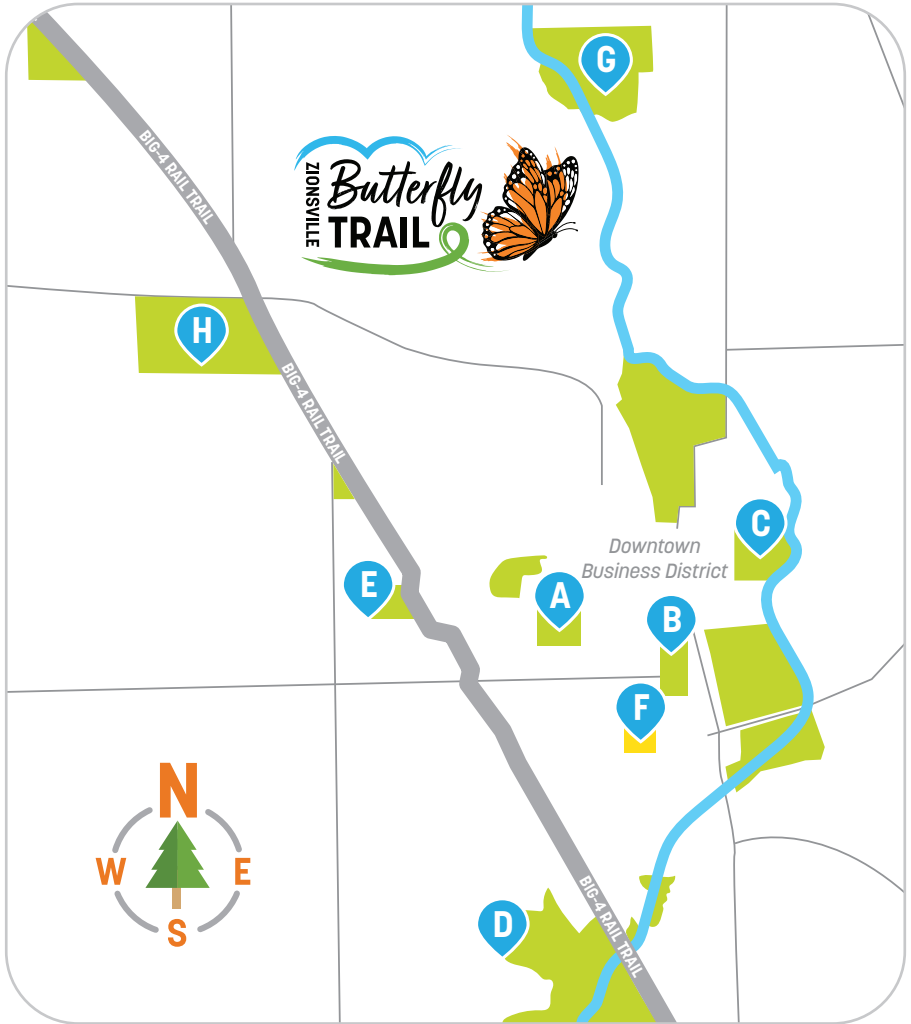
## Untitled
